ENTRIES MUST BE POSTMARKED NO LATER THAN D6CEMBER 1, 2011

1. No entry fee will be refunded except when an applicant withdraws his entry before the closing date for entries. Entry fees: \$2.50 per animal (Open or Youth); \$5.00 per meat pen; \$1.00 additional for Fur & Wool Classes.
2. This is an Official ARBA Sanctioned Show, Eric Stewart, American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc, PO Box 5667, Bloomington, IL 61702, Phone: 309-664-7500, Fax: 309-664-0941, Email: info@arba.net; and will be governed by the latest revised rules of that body. The completion of an entry blank indicates acceptance of these rules and regulations. Sanction Fees: Open \$25.00; Youth \$20.00. Dues: (1 year) Adult \$20.00; H/W \$30.00; Youth \$12.00; Family, Single Adult \$20.00 plus \$5.00 per youth; Family \$30.00 plus \$5.00 per child; (3 years) Adult \$50.00; H/W \$75.00; Youth \$30.00; Family, Single Adult, \$50.00 plus \$10.00 per youth; Family, H/W \$75.00 plus \$10.00 per child. Exhibitors need not be members of ARBA to enter a sanctioned show.
3. All animals that are to be exhibited are to be permanently and legibly earmarked in the left ear. All identification of stock will be by private ear numbers.
4. This is a closed entry show. **Entries must be postmarked by December 1, 2011.** Late postmarks will not be accepted regardless when entries were placed in the mail. Entry fee must accompany entry blank. Breeder forfeits entry fee for animals scratched after December 1, 2011.
5. **Substitutions can be made only within the class. Substitutions must be made through the show chairperson by December 31, 2011. No substitutions will be honored after this date.**
6. **All entries must list ear tattoo identification on the entry form. Failure to include all information on the entry blank will automatically disqualify your entry. All corrections/tattoo changes must be made with the show secretary by December 31, 2011.**
7. This is one day carrying cage show. All carriers must have leak-proof bottoms. Exhibitors are responsible to have their animals to the judging table for the proper class **and should not be expected to be called to the table.** All Best of Breed, Best Opposite Sex of Breed, Best of Variety, and Best Opposite Sex of Variety animals and the top ten (10) Meat Pens (approximately 200 animals) will be cooped and on exhibit for the remainder of the Farm Show. Only a business card sized advertisement may be placed on the cage card. No supplemental wires, cages, etc. will be permitted to be placed on the provided cages. **The completion of an entry blank indicates acceptance of this regulation. All placement awards and premiums will be forfeited if an animal is removed and the exhibitor will be barred for 2 years.** These animals will be released on Saturday, January 14, 2012 from 2:00 – 4:00 p.m. All animals MUST be removed by 4:00 p.m. Cavies are not required to be cooped for the week because of drafts and temperature changes.
8. Exhibitors attempting to or actually interfering with annoying, molesting or influencing a judge or acting in a manner unbecoming an exhibitor will be rejected and barred from the show with entry fee forfeited.
9. The show will be held in the Large Arena and all stock must be in the area by 8 a.m. Judging will start at 9 a.m. The area will open at 7:00 a.m.
10. Health Requirements: Judges will eliminate any stock found to be diseased while Judging.
11. All entries must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor prior to the show. Otherwise, the exhibitor forfeits all entry fees, premiums and rights to exhibit.
12. All animals must be exhibited in their natural condition. Exhibitors found violating this rule will have their animal disqualified and the remainder of their entry will be disqualified from competition and not be judged. Included in violations is dying, plucking, trimming or any other action designed to deceive.
13. Exhibitors must bring a food dish and water bottle to hang on outside of cage.
14. There will be no selling of any rabbits/cavies throughout the duration of the Farm Show.
15. Farm Show employees will clean the rabbits' cages every day. Self-cleaning is not an option. The completion of an entry blank indicates acceptance of this regulation.
16. For a youth exhibitor to qualify for premium money in the youth show, he/she must have carried a rabbit project in 4-H or FFA the calendar year preceeding the Farm Show

SPECIAL RABBIT MEAT PEN REGULATIONS:

GENERAL

Identification: Rabbits will be **permanently** tattooed with the youth exhibitor's private ear number.

Arrival time: All youth rabbit meat pens must be in place by 8 a.m. on Friday, January 5, 2012. Judging will begin at 9:00 a.m.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: Drug free affidavits apply. Judges will eliminate any stock found to be diseased.

JUNIOR RABBIT MEAT PEN CLASS

- A. Each exhibitor is limited to one rabbit meat pen. In preparation for Farm Show up to ten rabbits may be tattooed.
- B. A meat pen consists of 3 rabbits of the same breed and variety (*color*) as recognized and accepted in the current edition of the ARBA Standards of Perfection. They may be up to 10 weeks old (*70 days maximum*) and must weigh a minimum of 3 lbs. and maximum of 5 lbs. individually.
- C. Youth exhibitors must own the doe(s) and kits must be kindled in the owner's rabbitry November 1, 2010 or later.
 - 1) Owner must notify their county agent, 4-H club leader or FFA advisor of their intent to enter a meat pen before the doe is bred.
 - 2) Exhibitor must notify their county agent, 4-H club leader or FFA advisor within three days of the doe's kindling.
 - 3) Exhibitor must tattoo all rabbits to be grown for competition at 4 weeks of age in the presence of the county agent or FFA advisor. Up to ten rabbits may be tattooed. The agent or advisor must then sign the compliance statement listing the tattoo numbers.
 - 4) The compliance statement on page 161 **must be brought with the rabbits** to the Farm Show.
- D. Pen entry form found on page 159, must be sent to the Farm Show Director by December 1, 2011, with the correct entry fee.
- E. The exhibitor will choose 3 rabbits to present for competition who are most uniform in weight, show the best meat characteristics, and have no disqualifications as listed in the ARBA Standards of Perfection.
- F. Exhibitors will present their meat pen at 8:00 a.m. on Friday, January 6, 2012 to be weighed, checked for health requirements and disqualifications and judged. Judging will be done by an ARBA licensed judge.
- G. The top ten meat pens will be auctioned at 3:00 p.m., Sunday, January 8, 2012 in the Small Arena.
- H. Any youth exhibiting a junior rabbit meat pen must show his own pen of animals. In a case where the exhibitor is physically unable to attend the show due to ill health or family tragedy, another youth exhibitor must show the meat pen of rabbits.

MEAT CLASSES

1. Stewer: One rabbit, 6 months of age and over, minimum weight 8 pounds.
2. Roaster: One rabbit, under 6 months, not less than 5 ½ pounds nor over 8 pounds in weight.
3. Single Fryer: One rabbit, not over 10 weeks, 3 to 5 pounds weight.
4. Meat Pen: Three rabbits, all same breed and variety, not over 10 weeks, 3 to 5 pounds weight each rabbit.
5. Youth Stewer: One rabbit, 6 months of age and over, minimum weight 8 pounds.
6. Youth Roaster: One rabbit, under 6 months, not less than 5 ½ pounds nor over 8 pounds in weight.
7. Youth Single Fryer: One rabbit, not over 10 weeks, 3 to 5 pounds weight.
8. Youth Meat Pen: Three rabbits, all same breed and variety, not over 10 weeks, 3 to 5 pounds weight each rabbit.

Rules & Regulations:

1. Contest is open to any youth, 4-Her or FFA member who has a rabbit entered in the breed contest. **Pre-entry for Showmanship is required.** Entries are due December 1 with your breed entries. Exhibitors will compete according to their age as of January 1st (4-H age) with the exception of the Novice Class (1st project year participating in Showmanship). Use Entry Form found on page 155.
2. Rabbit used must be entered and shown in the Farm Show's Rabbit Show and be owned by the exhibitor competing in this department.
3. Exhibitors will meet with the judge and be scored individually. The score will be based on the following: carrying the rabbit to the table; posing, checking ears, teeth, eyes, and nose; checking toenails, hocks, front feet, abdomen, legs, and tail; checking sex, checking fur, the exhibitor's appearance, actions, and knowledge. Exhibitor's knowledge will be tested by answering questions related to the breed exhibited, diseases, and standard management practices. The exhibitor is not restricted to a specific order for the presentation. Blank score sheets are available from the Department Chairman, PaSRBA Board members, or online at www.pasrba.org.
4. Exhibitors will show in proper attire, which includes a long-sleeved top.
5. All showmanship contestants must check-in with the show chairpersons by 9:30 a.m. on Saturday, January 7.
