ENTRIES CLOSE NOVEMBER 3, 2011

1. **Application for Entry:** All applications for entry must be made on printed forms and in accordance with instructions on same. The forms, properly completed and signed, are to be filed in the office of the Director on or before November 3, at which time entries close. The open entry fee is \$15 per animal and must accompany the application for entry. In all cases the right is reserved to reject entirely, or accept conditionally, an entry or applications for entry. Animals to compose a competitive group need not be named for entry but will be selected for exhibit from among the individual entries (See class information on page 76-79.)

2. **Ownership:** To be eligible for competition, whether singly or in groups, animals must be bona fide property of the exhibitor at the opening date and time of show as evidenced by their registration paper issued by their US Breed Association. No photostats or other copies will be accepted. Pending transfers will not be accepted. Facimile copies of registration papers will be accepted if sent directly from the National Breed Association to Show Management and received no later than 5:00 p.m. the day before the breed show. All registration certificates will be checked by the management before the animal may enter the judging ring. Exhibitors are advised to keep registration certificates available at all times until the judging of the respective breed is completed.

If a herd is registered in the name of different members of a family and/or employees of the farm owner, these persons may enter the show as individual exhibitors or they may combine their entries and be considered one exhibitor. "Animals not owned by family members or employees of the farm owner may also be included in the Herd Unit if they are: (A.) Under the exclusive care and management of the herd owner, and, (B.) Housed, health tested, and production tested with the owner's herd for the six months immediately preceding the show." In order to qualify as a "Herd Unit" under this rule, all animals must be tested under one ownership or as one farm unit. Once the "Herd Unit" option is adopted all animals entered from the farm must be shown under the "Herd Unit." However, each individual owner must submit a separate entry blank.

A list of names of all individuals owning animals included in the "Herd Unit" and the name of the "Herd Unit" must be submitted with the application for entry and will be considered as one exhibitor throughout the Show. When the "Herd Unit" option is elected, all animals owned and exhibited by any member of the unit must be shown under the "Herd Unit" entry. This decision is final on the closing date for entries (November 3). If the "Herd Unit" is adopted, the 4-H and FFA animals become a part of the "Unit" and are subject to the limitations of 10 head per exhibitor regardless of breed.

If the "Herd Unit" option is elected, an animal owned by any person in the group may be substituted for one owned by any other person in the group. The animals in the "Herd Unit" may be combined to form an Exhibitor Herd, and to earn credits for PREMIER EXHIBITOR. PREMIER BREEDER points will be allotted according to the exact prefix of each animal shown. However the group will be limited to two premiums per open class and one entry per group class.

3. **Partnership Animals:** Animals owned in partnership or syndicate must be entered in partnership or syndicate named as a separate exhibitor, and one owner must be a resident of Pennsylvania and the animal housed and B.A.I. tested in Pennsylvania. "The Herd Unit" option applies to partnership or syndicate animals only when all members of the partnership or syndicate are from the same farm.
4. **Assignment of Space:** The available room for dairy cattle is limited. Space will be reserved for exhibitors in the order in which applications are received based upon date and time of postmark.

An exhibitor may not enter more than 10 animals, regardless of breed from any one herd as tested under one farm name by BAHLS including 4-H and FFA, but may show an unlimited number in any class.

A penalty of \$50 per animal will be assessed to the owner for each dairy animal entered and not exhibited at the Farm Show. Entries cancelled on or before November 3, 2011, will permit a refund of entry fees with no penalty. Entry cancellations received on or before December 27, 2011 will cause a forfeiture of entry fees without penalty. In extreme or unusual circumstances, a written appeal of the assessment of the penalty will be considered, if received by the Farm Show Director on or before Monday, January 9, 2012.

5. **Arrival & Release:** Dairy Cattle may arrive after 3:00 a.m. Monday, January 9, 2012 if housed in the Northeast Building or after 1:00 a.m. Tuesday if housed in the North Building and must be in place by 8:00 p.m. Tuesday, January 10, 2012. All animals will be released at 2:00 p.m. Saturday, January 14, 2012.
6. **Care of Animals:** Exhibitors are responsible for the transportation of their properly entered animals and the care of their animals during the exhibition.
7. **Health:** All cattle must be accompanied by a "Certificate of Veterinary Inspection" (CVI) signed by an accredited veterinarian. The CVI must be issued within 30 days, (on or after December 8, 2011) of the opening date of the show. Cattle must be identified by an official ear tag or other form of identification that has been approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture. See cattle health rules page 18.
It is strongly recommended that all cattle entering the show be immunized against IBR, PI3, BVD, and BRSV. It is strongly recommended that at least one vaccination against IBR, PI3, BVD, and BRSV be given after January 1, 2011.
8. **Grooming:** Use only grooming products that are approved for use on meat and milk producing animals when fitting any animal for show. Unapproved products may contain ingredients that result in unacceptable residues. If it is not certain that a product is residue safe and approved for use on meat and milk producing animals, don't use it. ****Important**!** If upon slaughter, treatment with drugs, biologics, or any chemical from fitting products, is the cause of condemnation of a carcass, the loss of the carcass and any other damages will be borne by the exhibitor.
9. **Catalog Number:** Each entry will be assigned a number and exhibitors on their arrival at the Show will receive on application a number, which must be displayed by attendant when animals are in the judging ring.

10. **Erroneous Entry:** Exhibitors that have been erroneously entered may, at the discretion of the Director, be transferred to their proper classes previous to the judging. If such classes have been judged they shall not be reopened. In no case shall the management be responsible for an alleged loss due to erroneous entry.
11. **Substitution:** All requests for substitution should be filed in writing with the Director on or before December 31, 2011 and include a new entry form. Only limited substitutions for animals entered, for reasons satisfactory to management, will be permitted after this date and up to opening date and time of show.
12. **Uniforms:** No attendant or other person leading animals will be allowed to enter the arena unless attired in suitable uniform.
13. **Milking Out:** Cows should not be shown with over-distended udders. The judge may require any or all cows to be milked out at time of judging, in case he considers it necessary in order to make an accurate comparison of udders.
14. **Exhibitor Herd:** Shall consist of four (4) animals, any age owned by exhibitor. A bonus premium will be paid in accordance with the number of animals in each group that are bred by the exhibitor. Each animal in the Exhibitor Herd class bred by the exhibitor will increase premium 25% over the base premium offered. Bonus premiums will apply to 1st thru 3rd in Milking Shorthorn and Guernsey, 1st thru 4th in Brown Swiss and Red & White, 1st thru 5th in Ayrshire, and 1st thru 7th in Holsteins and Jersey.
15. **Blocking Chutes:** A twenty-five (25) dollar fee must be paid by entry deadline for each blocking chute to be used during the Pennsylvania Farm Show. Each firm, farm or family is limited to one chute for 1 to 3 animals, two chutes for 4 to 6 animals, etc. A fee of \$50 must be paid for the first chute above these limits and \$100 each for all others. A sticker will be furnished by show management to serve as proof of payment. Blocking chutes must have this sticker affixed to the right, rear upright at eye level, and remain in designated areas or they will be removed from the grounds.
16. **NEW:** Exhibitors may purchase up to two (2) additional four (4) foot spaces at \$20 per space (\$40 total for two four foot spaces - Eight (8) feet total) if purchased prior to entry deadline.
17. Females that calve prior to the dates given for the breed's Fall Yearling in Milk class must show in the breed's Fall Yearling in Milk class

JUDGING

18. PDCA Judging School: Exhibitors must furnish and show their animals for PDCA Judging School as requested by management. Refusal to comply with requests for furnishing of animals may result in forfeit of premium and the exhibitor barred from showing in the future.
19. The decision of the judges shall be final in all cases, except where mistakes, fraud, misrepresentation or collusion, not discovered at the time of the award, are proved. In such cases the Director, or such referee as he may appoint, may make decision, or with his approval, the case may be appealed to the Show Commission from whose decision there can be no appeal. Overfitting of cattle will be discriminated against. Any artificial means used to change the form or shape of an animal will disqualify the animal for competition.
20. Judges shall report to the management any exhibitor or exhibitors who in anyway, whether in person or by agents or servants, interfere with them during the judging, or show any disrespect for them. A proper apology may be demanded from such exhibitor and his cattle may be excluded from competition and the Show Commission may withhold any premiums from such exhibitor.
21. Where there are fewer entries in any class than the number of premiums offered, the judges may, at their discretion, award a prize or prizes of such grade as the animals deserve.
22. The management reserves the right to withhold premiums awarded in any case in which it shall appear the regulations have not been compiled with, or fraud or deception have been practiced or attempted.

DRY COW CLASS

22. A dry cow must have freshened at least once but is not in milk at show time and may be shown in one class only: either the wet or dry cow class. The original entry should be made in the proper class; however, final determination of class will be made at check-in time.

JUNIOR BEST THREE FEMALES

23. This group to consist of three (3) females from the heifer classes, none of which have freshened, all bred and at least one owned by the exhibitor.

BEST UDDERED COW

24. A special ribbon will be awarded for the best uddered cow in each cow class, except in dry cow classes. "Championship" Best Udder - Best udder cow from each milking class eligible to compete for the Championship rosette.

PREMIER BREEDER

25. Premier breeder award will be made to the breeder of animals credited with the most points on not to exceed 6 animals in the open single classes exhibited by himself and/or other exhibitors. No more than 2 animals per class will be counted.

PREMIER EXHIBITOR

- 26. Premier exhibitor award will be made to the exhibitor credited with the most points on 6 animals owned and exhibited by himself, or less and limited to the owned and exhibited in the open single classes. No more than 2 animals per class will be counted.
- 27. Premier Awards will be based on the following point scale:

SUPREME CHAMPION

- 28. Following the open shows, there will be a Parade of Champions of each of the seven breeds. Champions will be shown “milked out” from this group of animals, the judges will select a Supreme Champion of the Dairy Show - \$1,000.00 Premium and Banner. Runnerup will receive \$200 - all others will receive \$50.

GOOD HOUSEKEEPING AWARDS

- 29. The Pennsylvania Farm Show Commission offers special daily premiums to dairy cattle exhibitors who maintain the most attractive and sanitary exhibit at the 2012 Pennsylvania Farm Show.

Exhibits of five cattle or more will be scored on the following basis:

1. Preparation Of Exhibit Points
 - a. adequate bedding, bedding properly packed, level pack, straw clean and bright 10
 - b. animals attractively arranged and correctly spaced (neither too close or too far apart) 10
 - c. decorations neat and attractive, well-planned, not too gaudy or overdone 5
 - d. appropriate animal signs displaying complete information 10
 - e. appropriate color scheme, background, show boxes, and originality 5
 2. Appearance and attitude of exhibitors
 - a. knowledgeable, courteous, friendly, and able to answer questions about the exhibit and cattle 10
 - b. clothes and person neat and clean dressed appropriately 5
 3. Care of the exhibit
 - a. animals clean and well-groomed 15
 - b. aisles are clean and neat with adequate width for spectators to walk through 10
 - c. bedding clean and dry, shows evidence of frequent reworking, rear edge is neat and straight 10
 - d. feed and equipment stored neatly, (out of sight if possible), equipment clean 10

Inspections will be made unannounced. Exhibitors will be scored daily and their rating for the day published. Prizes will be awarded Wednesday through Friday with grand prizes for the total period.

YOUTH DIVISION CLASS

Eligibility: These classes are open to 4-H Club and FFA members. Exhibitors must have been born from 1992 through 2002 inclusive. Exhibitors must be 4-H members carrying a dairy project, under the supervision of the Pennsylvania State University Agricultural Extension Service or a dues paying FFA member carrying a dairy project under the supervision of a Pennsylvania Agricultural Education Instructor. No exhibitor shall be eligible who does not take entire charge and care of his livestock except in the case of illness or some other reason approved by the Farm Show Commission. (Does not apply to breaking calf to lead). If there is a valid reason that the exhibitor cannot show his/her animal(s), then another member who meets the requirements may show that animal(s); however, this member will not qualify for the showmanship contest.

1. **Entries:** Entries will be limited to three animals per exhibitor. The three animals may be all 4-H, all vocational or a combination between 4-H and FFA that add up to three. A minimum of 10 junior division animals will be accepted in each breed. Animals exhibited in the youth division classes must be entered and shown in open classes. Entry in the open class must be indicated on the entry blank and class specified. The regular open entry fee of \$15.00 must accompany the application. Such entries must be shown by owner or another 4-H Club member or vocational student; they cannot be shown by an adult.
2. **Caretakers:** Each club, school or county unit must provide one caretaker for each ten or less animals and make provision for his expenses.
3. **Substitutions:** Substitutions of eligible entries may be made when late elimination may have become necessary, for reasons satisfactory to the management.
4. **Ownership:** No contestant shall be eligible who does not take entire care of his or her owned animals before the show. Unless bred by exhibitor, registration certificate or transfer showing that the animal was owned in the club member's name on or before June 1 must be presented to the management prior to the time of judging. Partnership ownership will not be accepted. Leased animals may be exhibited at the Pennsylvania Farm Show. Existence of a lease must be verified by the home county Extension Office or school; the Extension Office or school must have the lease and/or project plan (or knowledge of the lease) recorded by June 1, 2011. Leased animals must be housed in Pennsylvania. Cows may only be leased by the exhibitor only if they were previously leased as calves or yearlings. Parents, guardians and siblings are not permitted to lease animals to their children; likewise, an exhibitor who owns dairy cattle may not lease other project animals. At the time of check-in, exhibitors of leased animals must present a copy of a signed lease, signed project plan, or verification letter from an extension agent or teacher that the animal is a properly leased animal.
5. **Safety:** The management will use care to insure the safety of the animals, entered and shown, but will not be responsible for any accident, loss or damage of any animal in this show.
6. **Showing:** Animals must be shown by 4-H Club or FFA members. If the actual owner of an animals is unable to be present and show in person, another member may be permitted to show the animal in his stead. The substitute showman must be another 4-H or FFA Member of the same age or younger.
7. **Awards:** Awards will be made on the merit of the animal only.
8. **Transportation Allowance:** See Rule 27, page 17 and chart on page 20.
9. **Rules:** Rules regarding health, feed, care and sanitation will be the same in the youth division as in open classes. See Rule 31, page 17.
10. **Age:** The age of all animals will be determined according to birth dates, page 79.
