“NEW” ENTRIES CLOSE NOVEMBER 15, 2011

1. Entries received up to the closing date for making entries if space is available and shall be based approximately on the following allocation: LARGE FOWL & DUCKS 900; BANTAMS 950; GEESE & TURKEYS 150. Should the number of entries of any type of poultry exceed the allotment, a reduction will be made for that type of poultry in the following manner: The first 40 (10 geese and/or turkeys) entries of each exhibitor will not be subjected to reduction. Entries in excess of 40 will be reduced for all exhibitors on a pro rata basis.
 - a. All poultry exhibited at the Pennsylvania Farm Show must be owned by the exhibitor and housed in Pennsylvania from the time entry is made until exhibited at the Farm Show.
2. The showroom will be open to receive birds from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Friday, January 6, 2012. All exhibitors with more than 100 entries must be checked in by the PDA Health official by 4 p.m. Any exhibitors with less than 100 entries must be checked in by the PDA Health official by 6 p.m. ALL entries must be in their coops by 6:30 p.m. NO exceptions will be made. Any birds NOT cooped by 6:30 p.m. will not be allowed in the show, NO exceptions. All birds will be strictly observed for general Health at check in. Birds showing any respiratory symptoms or signs of scaly leg, frozen combs or toes, or are extremely dirty or in poor feather condition will be denied entry into the show. The birds can be cooped only under the supervision of the show management.
 - a. Judging will begin at 9:00 a.m., Saturday, January 7, 2012 in the East Hall.
 - b. All birds will be released Saturday, January 14, 2012 at 2:00 p.m., and must be removed by 7:00 p.m. Birds must be cooped out under the supervision of show management.
 - c. All birds will be fed and watered daily during Farm Show.
 - d. An Awards program and exhibitor meeting will be held in show area at 1:00 p.m., Saturday, January 14, 2012.
3. Not more than TWO entries may be entered in one class by one exhibitor. (*For example, one exhibitor may not enter more than two White Rock cockerels*). NO SUBSTITUTION of entries may be made after closing date of entries.
4. Information will be sent to exhibitors listing the number of the cage to which the birds are assigned.
5. The management reserves the right to make any alterations which may seem desirable for the best interests of the show.

Health Requirements

1. **Identification:** All Pennsylvania poultry, waterfowl, upland game birds, and pigeons entering an exhibition must bear a unique individual identification leg band (official state-issued leg bands are not required).
2. **Owner-Endorsed Health Certificate:** An official Owner-Endorsed Poultry Health Certificate must accompany all entries to the show and will be collected prior to cooping at the show premises. This certificate must be endorsed with the poultry owner's signature. This certificate is printed on page 89 of this book and additional certificates for the Farm Show are available from the Pennsylvania Farm Show Complex & Expo Center, 2300 North Cameron Street, Harrisburg, PA 17110-9443.
3. All animals must be free of infectious, contagious, and external parasitic diseases. Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival will not be allowed into the Farm Show Building.
4. **Testing Requirements:**
All live poultry shown must meet the following three (3) requirements (all samples for testing must be collected by a Certified Poultry Technician or an Accredited Veterinarian):

(a). Avian Influenza Testing and Verification:

- * All poultry, waterfowl, upland game birds, and ratites, (*pigeons excluded*) for exhibition must originate from a flock in good standing in the Pennsylvania Avian Influenza Monitored Flock program; or from a flock in good standing in the NPIP Avian Influenza Clean program;

OR

- * The birds must originate from a flock in which a minimum of 30 birds representative of the flock, 3 weeks of age or older, were tested negative for avian influenza within the 6 months prior to opening date of the exhibition and the birds are accompanied by the test report. If there are fewer than 30 birds in the flock, test all birds. **For waterfowl, cloacal swab samples must be collected for testing, and the swabs must be tested using virus isolation techniques.**

*****NOTE: Verification of PA AI Monitored Flock or NPIP AI Clean flock status, or a current official test report, must accompany all poultry (including waterfowl), upland game birds, and ratites.*****

(b). Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Testing and Verification:

- * All poultry, upland game birds, and ratites (*pigeons and waterfowl excluded*) must originate from a flock in good standing in the NPIP Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Program or from a flock in good standing in the PA Pullorum Equivalent Program;

OR

- Individual birds (*pigeons and waterfowl excluded*) for exhibition must have had a negative pullorum-typhoid test within the 90 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition. The following age restrictions apply to comply with NPIP standards:
 - Chickens shall be tested at 4 months of age or older.
 - Turkeys shall be tested at 12 weeks of age or older.
 - Game birds shall be tested at 4 months of age or older, or upon sexual maturity, whichever comes first.
 - Ratites shall be tested at 12 months of age or older.
 - If birds are not old enough to be test-eligible, they must either be members of an NPIP U.S. Pullorum- Typhoid Clean flock or a PA Pullorum Equivalent Program Flock; or must come from a flock in which all test-eligible birds in the flock have been tested negative within the 90 days prior to exhibition.

*****NOTE: Verification of NPIP Pullorum-Typhoid Clean or PA Pullorum Equivalent Program flock status, or a current official negative test**

report, must accompany all poultry (excluding pigeons and waterfowl), upland game birds, and ratites.***

(c). Vaccinated for Laryngotracheitis. All chickens for exhibit must be from flocks vaccinated against infectious laryngotracheitis no more than one (1) year and no less than thirty (30) days before cooping day of the show. LT-IVAX administered in full accordance with manufacturer's instructions is the only acceptable vaccine.

5. **All crates and coops used to transport poultry to and from the Farm Show shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected before and after such use.**
6. No specimen is to be handled by anyone other than the owner, judge or representative of the show management, unless permission is given by the owner.
7. No person shall interfere with the judges in any manner while in the performance of their duties. Judges will be encouraged by the management to give exhibitors reasons for awarding a prize, or for discriminating against a bird. Such information can be given after the judge has finished placing awards for a particular breed or variety.
8. No name and no distinctive marks or decorations will be allowed on the coops until after the premiums have been awarded.
9. Any useful advertising material approved by the Director may be placed on the cages after the awards are made.
10. To compete for display prizes donated by the State Farm Show Commission, an exhibitor of standard chickens, bantams, waterfowl must exhibit at least six individuals of one variety, including cock, hen, cockerel and pullet. All ties shall be broken by the subsequent decision of the Judge.
11. **Sale of poultry is prohibited until after the birds have been cooped out by the exhibitor with supervision of show management or premiums will be forfeited.**
12. All awards for display made by State Farm Show Commission will be decided in the following manner: First prize counts six points, second prize four points, third prize three points, fourth prize two points, fifth prize one point. Each prize to be multiplied by the number exhibited in the class. (*For example, first prize Silver Wyandotte cockerel with fifteen in class counts ninety points*).

GENERAL CLASSIFICATIONS

Large Chickens - Classes will be provided for all varieties listed in the Premium List for cock, hen, cockerel and pullet.

Bantams - Classes will be provided for all varieties listed in the Premium List for cock, hen, cockerel and pullet.

Geese - Classes will be provided for all varieties listed in the Premium List for old gander, old goose, young gander and young goose.

Ducks - Classes will be provided for all varieties listed in the Premium List for old drake, old duck, young drake and young duck.

Turkeys - Classes will be provided for all varieties listed in the Premium List for old tom, old hen, young tom and young hen.

MEDAL AWARDS

APA Medal awarded for the following Class Champions when ten (10) or more are judged in class: Large Chickens - American, Asiatic, English, Mediterranean, Continental, All Other Standard Breeds; Bantam Chickens - Modern Game, Old English Game, Single Comb Clean Legged, Rose Comb Clean Legged, Feather Legged, All Other Comb Clean Legged; Ducks - Heavy, Medium, Light, Bantam; Geese - Heavy, Medium, Light; Turkeys; Guinea Fowl.

JUNIOR AWARDS

An APA Medal plus one (1) year Junior Membership will be given for the following Champions shown by junior exhibitors: Champion Large Chicken, Champion Bantam Chicken, Champion Duck, Champion Goose, Champion Turkey, Champion Guinea Fowl. Juniors need not be members to receive these Junior awards. All Judging shall be by the latest edition of the American Standard of Perfection, copyrighted by the American Poultry Association, Inc. Dues will be accepted in the showroom prior to judging or they may be sent to American Poultry Association, Pat Horstman, Secretary, PO Box 306 Burgettstown, PA 15021, (724) 729 3459, but must be prior to judging to be eligible for APA awards. APA District Director is S. Robert Powell. APA State Representative is Roland Romig.

AMERICAN BANTAM ASSOCIATION *Special Meet*

Pins for Champion and Reserve for all seven bantam divisions providing there are 25 birds competing.

Pins for all starred wins in the show.

Only ABA members are eligible to compete for the above awards. Dues are \$15.00 per year. \$40.00 for three years. New members receive a copy of the quarterly and the latest available copy of the Annual American Bantam Association Yearbook which lists 900 advertisers and includes a complete breed and variety index. Winners of ABA awards are listed in the year book under Who's Who in Bantams. Starred wins are earned by Champions and Reserve Champions in the seven bantams divisions when the number of birds competing is 100 or more. Starred wins are also awarded to Best and Reserve of Breed and Variety when 100 or more birds are competing. 3. Verification of Testing for PENNSYLVANIA Birds:

A. Avian Influenza Clean Testing and Verification. All samples must be collected by a Certified Poultry Technician or an Accredited Veterinarian:

- All poultry, waterfowl, upland game birds, and ratites, (*pigeons excluded*) for exhibition must originate from a flock in good standing in the Pennsylvania Avian Influenza Monitored Flock program, or from a flock in good standing in the NPIP Avian Influenza Clean program, and the birds must be accompanied by the most recent negative test report (copy acceptable). The NPIP or AI MF number must be noted on the report;

OR

- The birds must originate from a flock in which a minimum of 30 birds, 3 weeks of age or older, were tested negative for avian influenza within the 6 months prior to opening date of the exhibition and the birds must be accompanied by the negative test report (copy acceptable). If there are fewer than 30 birds in the flock, test all birds. *For waterfowl, cloacal swab samples must be collected for testing, and the swabs must be tested using virus isolation techniques.*

B. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Testing and Verification (*pigeons and waterfowl excluded*). All samples must be collected by a Certified Poultry Technician or an Accredited Veterinarian:

- All poultry, upland game birds, and ratites (*pigeons and waterfowl excluded*) must originate from a flock in good standing in the NPIP Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Program or from a flock in good standing in the PA Pullorum Equivalent Program and the birds must be accompanied by the most recent negative test report (copy acceptable). The NPIP number must be noted on the report for NPIP Pullorum-Typhoid Clean flocks. If bird-side testing was done, the 9-2 or state equivalent form must accompany the birds (copy acceptable);

OR

- Individual birds (*pigeons and waterfowl excluded*) for exhibition must have had a negative pullorum-typhoid test within the 90 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition. The birds must be accompanied by the negative test report (copy acceptable). The following age restrictions apply to comply with NPIP standards:
 - Chickens shall be tested at 4 months of age or older.
 - Turkeys shall be tested at 12 weeks of age or older.
 - Game birds shall be tested at 4 months of age or older, or upon sexual maturity, whichever comes first.
 - Ratites shall be tested at 12 months of age or older.
 - All birds not meeting these age restrictions are exempt from pullorum testing requirements.

4. Verification of Testing for OUT-OF-STATE Birds:

A. Avian Influenza Clean Testing and Verification: All samples must be collected by a Certified Poultry Technician or an Accredited Veterinarian. Poultry, waterfowl, upland game birds, and ratites (*pigeons excluded*) shall only be allowed into the Commonwealth and the exhibition after meeting one of the following requirements:

- The birds originate from a flock in good standing in the NPIP Avian Influenza Clean program and the shipment is accompanied by a USDA form 9-3 or equivalent Department-approved form;

OR

- The birds originate from a flock that participates in an equivalent avian influenza monitoring program and the shipment is accompanied by a document from the state, nation, or province of origin indicating participation;

OR

- The birds originate from a flock in which a minimum of 30 birds, 3 weeks of age or older, were tested negative for avian influenza within the 30 days prior to opening date of the exhibition and the birds must be accompanied by the negative test report (copy acceptable). If there are fewer than 30 birds in the flock, test all birds. *For waterfowl, cloacal swab samples must be collected for testing, and the swabs must be tested using virus isolation techniques.*

B. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Testing and Verification (*pigeons and waterfowl excluded*). All samples must be collected by a Certified Poultry Technician or an Accredited Veterinarian:

- All poultry, upland game birds, and ratites (*pigeons and waterfowl excluded*) must come from NPIP Pullorum-Typhoid Clean flocks and the birds must be accompanied by a USDA form 9-3 or equivalent Department-approved form;

OR

- Individual birds (*pigeons and waterfowl excluded*) for exhibition must have had a negative pullorum-typhoid test within the 90 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition. The birds must be accompanied by the negative test report (copy acceptable). If bird-side testing was done, the 9-2 form must accompany the birds (copy acceptable). The following age restrictions apply to comply with NPIP standards:
 - Chickens shall be tested at 4 months of age or older.
 - Turkeys shall be tested at 12 weeks of age or older.
 - Game birds shall be tested at 4 months of age or older, or upon sexual maturity, whichever comes first.
 - Ratites shall be tested at 12 months of age or older.
 - All birds not meeting these age restrictions must come from a flock in which all of the birds in the flock have been test negative within the 90 days prior to the exhibition.

5. Bird identification: All poultry, waterfowl, upland game birds, and pigeons entering an exhibition must bear an individual identification leg band. Ratites must be identified with a neck band or an electronic implant device (the exhibitor must supply a reader).

6. Verification of flock health status:

All poultry, waterfowl, upland game birds, ratites, and pigeons for exhibit or display are part of a flock which is free from evidence of contagious diseases.
