## HOW THE PROGRAM BEGAN...

The Farm Show Scholarship Foundation was created through the efforts of two 4-H members – and the buyers of their animals – who donated proceeds of their champions to start the program. The Foundation is partially funded only from the proceeds of the Annual Youth Livestock Auction. Additional funding comes from donations, memberships, gifts and various fund raising activities.

It is refreshing in today's "me" society to find responsible young people with the desire to bring about a program that benefits many youth – our future leaders.

Not every 4-H or FFA member has the good fortune to exhibit a grand champion steer, hog or lamb. However, each one of these young people has a dream for tomorrow. Those dreams may include higher education, owning their own farms, or improving their livestock projects.

The Scholarship program was created by young people who understand the value of giving back a portion of what they've received, so others can benefit.

## HOW DO BUYERS BENEFIT?

The first benefit is the satisfaction of helping dreams come true for young exhibitors. Buyers' support rewards the values of hard work, persistence and honesty.

Buyers also benefit from the publicity received when they purchase animals. Local, regional and statewide media are notified of the purchases, and some promotional materials are provided.

The Farm Show Youth Foundation is a non-profit organization. Contributions and the amount spent for an animal above market value is tax deductible.

## PARTICIPATION...

### *Animal Purchase – Without Possession*

Each animal sold at the Livestock Auction has a predetermined market value promised by a packer. The buyer pays only the difference between the market value and the final bid; but receives recognition for purchasing the animal.

Example: The market value of a lamb is \$100. The final bid is \$350. The buyer pays \$250; the packer pays \$100 and gets the animal.

You may send your bid with the exhibitor or contact the committee to handle your bid.

### *Animal Purchase – With Possession*

Some buyers prefer to pay the full price at the time of the auction and take possession of the animal. Retailers have also displayed animals at their place of business to assist in attracting customers. The buyer is responsible for the animal and its care following the sale.

## YOUTH LIVESTOCK AUCTION

The "Cream of the Crop" arrives in Harrisburg each January for the Pennsylvania Farm Show. 4-H and FFA members have groomed, fed and trained their animals for stiff competition. These entries represent the very best the state has to offer.
